Currently the online magazine has a monthly range of approx. 200.000 readers.

- Professional editorial experience in online journalism and social media with significant knowledge of publication formats in Germany and abroad. Experience of editorial processes is desirable.
- University degree in journalism, political science, economics or social sciences, with a formal qualification/training in journalism.
- Strong analytical skills in relation to European and international politics.
- Sound knowledge of journalistic practices and ethics with a clear sense of relevance and topicality on current political questions.
- Demonstrate creativity and proficiency in grammar and usage in writing, editing, and choosing headlines.
- Ability to work independently and under pressure to meet deadlines.
- Excellent communication, writing, presentation and diplomacy skills.
- Excellent written and spoken fluency of English (native speaker level); good command of German.
